

PARTICIPATING IN YOUR **plan**

There are many benefits to participating in the T.M. Cobb and Haley Brothers 401(k) Plan. One of the primary benefits is that you will receive help reaching your financial goals for retirement. By reviewing the important information in this guide and visiting Fidelity NetBenefits® at www.401k.com, you can take advantage of what your company and Fidelity have to offer.

When am I eligible for the Plan?

You are eligible to participate in the Plan if:

- you are employed by the Employer
- you are at least 18 years old
- and you are not:
- a leased employee
- Part-Time employees

The Plan does not cover employees who are residents of Puerto Rico.

How do I enroll?

To enroll, log on to Fidelity NetBenefits[®] at www.401k.com. Please also complete the beneficiary form and return it to your company's benefits department.

Remember to choose your investment options when you enroll. If you do not select an investment, your Plan Sponsor has directed Fidelity to place your contributions in the American Funds Target Date Retirement target date fund that most closely aligns with your projected retirement date based upon your birth year.

When is my enrollment effective?

Once you satisfy these requirements, you will become eligible to participate in the Plan on January 1, April 1, July 1, or October 1.

How much can I contribute?

Through automatic payroll deduction, you may contribute between 2% and 75% of your eligible pay on a pretax and/or Roth basis, up to the annual IRS dollar limit (2024 = \$23,000). You may change your deferral percentage as applicable. Any changes made would take effect at the beginning of each payroll period.

In addition, you can automatically increase your retirement savings plan contributions each year through the Annual Increase Program. To sign

up, access the Contributions section within NetBenefits[®], or call the plan's toll-free number.

If you are age 50 or over by the end of the taxable year and have reached the annual IRS limit or Plan's maximum contribution limit for the year, you may make additional salary deferral contributions to the Plan up to the IRS Catch-Up Contribution Limit (2024= \$7,500).

Unlike your traditional, pretax 401(k) deferrals, the Roth 401(k) feature allows you to contribute after-tax dollars, but then withdraw tax-free dollars from your account when you retire, provided the distribution is "qualified." A qualified distribution is one that is taken after the five taxable year period beginning January 1 of the year for which your first designated Roth contribution to the plan is made (or to a previous plan, if that amount was subsequently rolled over to the distributing plan) AND you turn age 59 ½, become disabled, or die. If you are eligible to make traditional pretax 401(k) contributions, you can also make Roth 401(k) after-tax contributions. Your total contributions to the plan (both Roth 401(k) after-tax deferrals and traditional pretax contributions) cannot exceed IRS limits, or your plan's limit, if less.

Can I move money from another retirement plan into this one?

You may be permitted to roll over eligible contributions into this Plan from a previous employer's retirement plan. For other eligible account types, please see your Summary Plan Description. Once you have confirmed that your Employer will accept your rollover contribution, you can get started in the "Rollovers" section online. Be sure to consider all your available options and the applicable fees and features of each before moving your retirement assets.

Does the Company contribute to my account?

The Employer may make a discretionary deferral matching contribution to your account. The amount would be equal to a percentage determined annually by a Board of Directors' Resolution.

To be eligible for discretionary matching contributions you are required to:

 make employee pretax deferral contributions or Roth 401(k) after-tax deferral contributions. The plan will match on the combined total of these contributions up to the matching limit.

For purposes of determining your matching contributions under the Plan, your deferral contributions will include Age 50 and over Catch-Up Contributions described above.

Your Employer may designate all or a portion of any matching contributions for a Plan Year as "qualified matching contributions" and allocate them to employees to help the Plan pass one or more annually required Internal Revenue Code nondiscrimination test(s). Any such contributions will be allocated to those non-highly compensated Participants eligible to receive the Employer matching contributions described above who made deferral contributions during the Plan Year. Participants are 100% vested in these contributions and may not request a hardship withdrawal of these contributions.

Long-term, part-time employees are not eligible to receive any matching contributions.

The Employer may make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to only those participants who are eligible under the terms of the plan. Please refer to your employer or Summary Plan Description for more detailed information.

Long-term, part-time employees are not eligible to receive any profit sharing contributions.

When am I vested?

The term "vesting" refers to the portion of your account balance that you are entitled to under the plan's rules.

You are always 100% vested in your:

- employee pretax account
- rollover account

- Roth 401(k) after-tax deferral account
- and any earnings thereon.

Employer profit sharing contributions, matching contributions and earnings will be vested in accordance with the following schedule:

Can I take a loan from my account?

Although your plan account is intended for your retirement, you may take a loan from your account.

Can I make withdrawals from my account?

Withdrawals from the Plan are generally permitted in the event of termination of employment, retirement, disability, as a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), or death.

How do I access my account?

Within NetBenefits® you have access to your account information, retirement planning tools, and e-Learning workshops® that provide you access to self-paced training on savings and investing principles.

You may call the Retirement Benefits Line at 1-800-835-5097 between 8:30 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on any business day when the New York Stock Exchange is open. Fidelity Representatives can assist you with transactions and answer many of your questions regarding retirement savings.

STABLE VALUE FUNDS

New York Life Guaranteed Interest Account GAF₆

Objective:

New York Life Guaranteed Interest Account (GIA) is a general account group annuity contract seeking to provide a low-risk, stable investment option. It aims to provide participants with a competitive yield and limited volatility with a guarantee of principal and accumulated interest.

Strategy:

The New York Life Guaranteed Interest Account (GIA) is a stable value product that guarantees principal and accumulated interest. Guarantees are provided to participating retirement plans through a group annuity contract issued by New York Life Insurance Company (New York Life). Contributions are directed to a broadly diversified fixed income portfolio within New York Life's general account. The GIA crediting rate is subject to change every six months following the first contract year. New York Life issues the GIA group annuity contract and provides the guarantee of principal and accumulated interest.

The fund is backed by a diversified portfolio of fixed-income assets held in the general account of the issuer. Guarantees are subject to the claims paying ability of the issuer. Restrictions or fees may apply to exchanges or withdrawals. The Contracts provide for the payment of certain withdrawals and exchanges at book value during the terms of the Contracts. In order to maintain the Contract issuers' promise to pay such withdrawals and exchanges at book value, the Contracts subject the fund and its participants to certain restrictions. For example, withdrawals prompted by certain events (e.g., layoffs, early retirement windows, spin-offs, sale of a division, facility closings, plan terminations, partial plan terminations, changes in laws or regulations) may be paid at the market value of the fund's securities, which may be less than your book value balance or may restrict withdrawals in these events. BlackRock High Yield Bond Portfolio Institutional Shares OKPZ

Objective:

The investment seeks to maximize total return, consistent with income generation and prudent investment management.

Strategy:

The fund invests primarily in non-investment grade bonds with maturities of ten years or less. It normally invests at least 80% of its assets in high yield bonds. The fund may invest up to 30% of its assets in non-dollar denominated bonds of issuers located outside of the United States. The fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing under normal circumstances at least 80% of its assets in Fixed Income Instruments. It will invest under normal circumstances in Fixed Income Instruments that are economically tied to at least three non-U.S. countries. The fund invests primarily in investment grade debt securities, but may invest up to 10% of its total assets in junk bonds as rated by Moody's, S&P or Fitch, or, if unrated, as determined by PIMCO. 


